Majority of the population is Syrian (99%)



Main non-Syrian nationalities are Iraqi, Sudanese, Ethiopian



52% are females and 48% are males



55% are children, 43% are adults, 2% are elderly



25% of the population was born in Lebanon

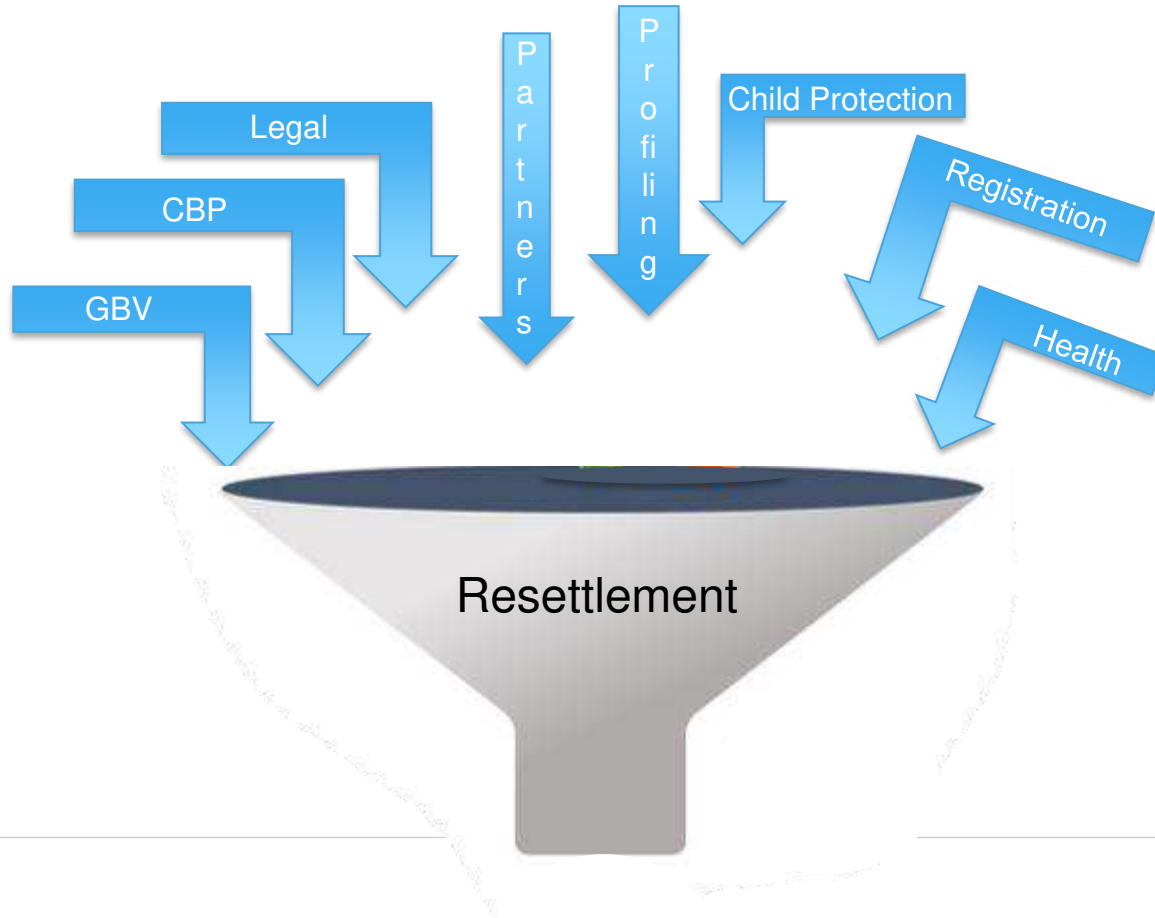

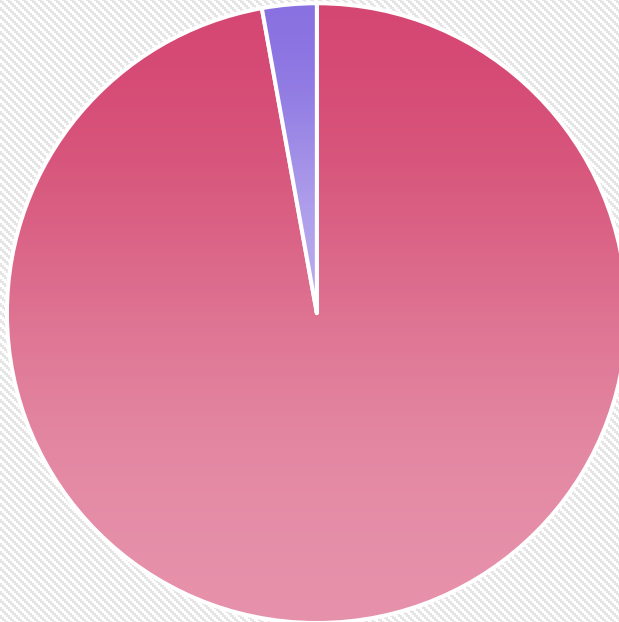

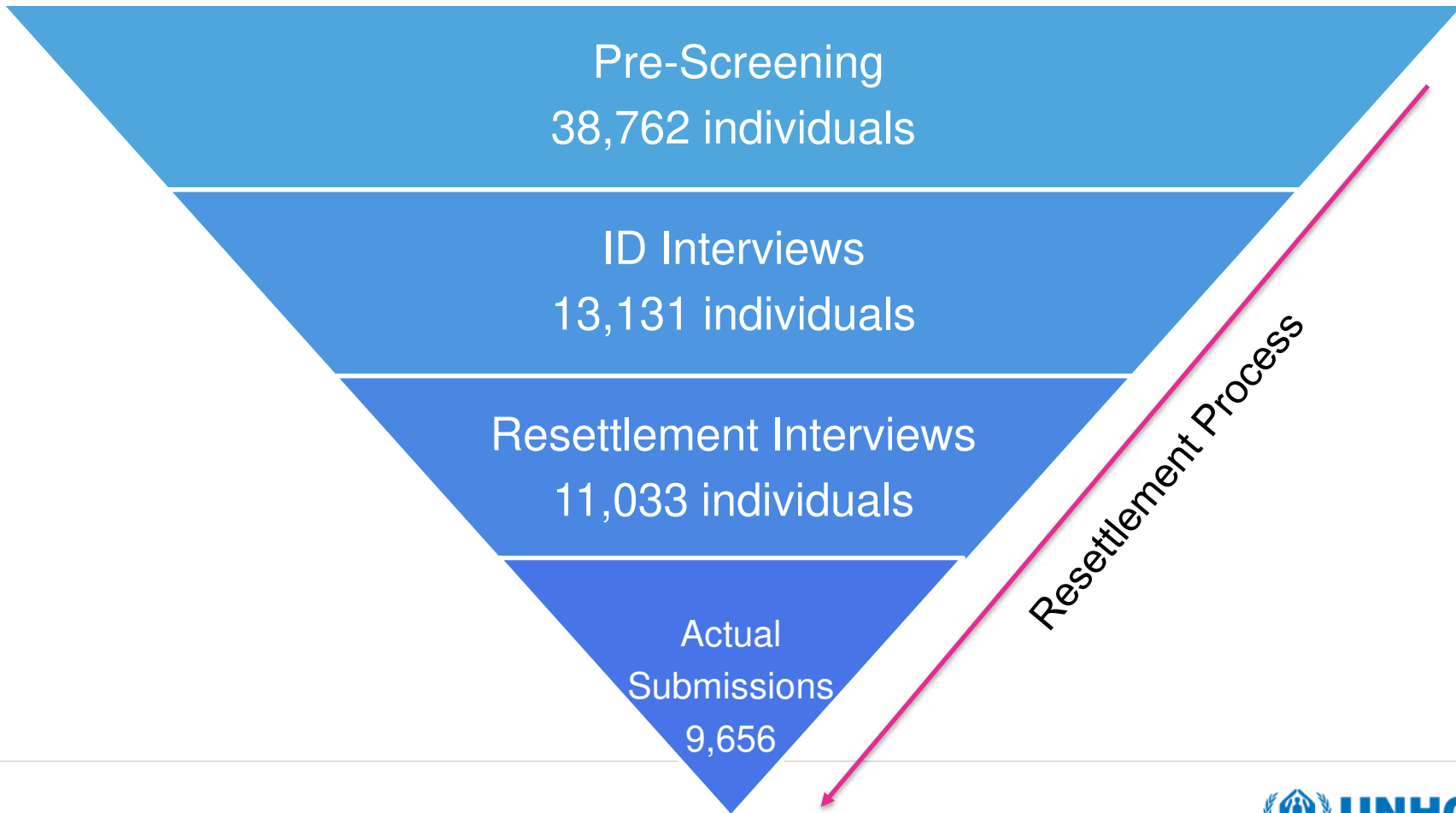
